The Ada City Schools' Subject Area Course Guide has been designed to help students plan for academic success. The pathways listed below are suggested pathways that will allow students to meet or exceed graduation requirements. Course offerings are subject to student enrollment and staff availability.

## ENGLISH

High school English courses are designed to ensure that students are grounded in the study of composition, grammar, and literary analysis. Each year, students will continue to increase critical reading, writing, and thinking skills through works of fiction and nonfiction. In alignment with Oklahoma Academic Standards and College Board Standards, students will be prepared for success on assessments such as the Oklahoma End of Instruction Examinations as well as on national ACT, PSAT, and SAT tests. Students are required to take four years of English by either completing a required or an accelerated pathway.

## MATHEMATICS

High school mathematics courses are developed to ensure that students are grounded in mathematical concepts. Emphasis is placed on numerical operations which require students to reason, solve, interpret, graph, create, and analyze. Courses are aligned to state academic standards and are designed to prepare students for Oklahoma End of Instruction Examinations in Algebra I, Algebra II, and Geometry as well as ACT, PSAT, and SAT tests. Students are required to take three years of high school mathematics but are encouraged to take one of the accelerated pathways which offers specific college preparatory curriculum.

### Accelerated Mathematics Pathways

Students who choose to enroll in an accelerated mathematics pathway are encouraged to take four or five years of high school mathematics. The capstone mathematics course offered at Ada High School is Advanced Placement Calculus (AB). In order for students to enroll in the capstone course, students must complete the following PREREQUISITE:

Advanced Placement Calculus (AB)---Prerequisite of Pre-Advanced Placement Trigonometry/College Algebra

The Advanced Mathematics Pathway options which follow are provided as a tool to help students plan future enrollment opportunities. Conversations between students, parents, and school counselors, combined with the student's post-secondary and career interests, will ultimately determine which pathway is best for the student. In addition, it is important to note that a student does not become "locked in" to a particular pathway upon initial enrollment in a plan of study.

## SCIENCE

High school science students are required to take three years of laboratory science. Science courses are designed for students to study scientific principles and methods, to interpret data, and to think clearly and logically about the world around them. Students enrolled in Biology or Advanced Placement Biology will be expected to take an Oklahoma End of Instruction Examination.

### Accelerated Science Pathways

Students who choose to enroll in an Accelerated Science Pathway are encouraged to take four years of laboratory science. The Capstone Science Courses offered at Ada High School are Advanced Placement Biology, Advanced Placement Chemistry, Advanced Placement Environmental Science and Physics. In order for students to enroll in Capstone Courses, students must complete the following PREREQUISITES:

Advanced Placement Biology--- Prerequisite of Biology or Pre-AP Biology and Chemistry

Advanced Placement Chemistry--- Prerequisites of Biology or Pre-AP Biology and Chemistry

Advanced Placement Environmental Science---Prerequisites of Biology or Pre-AP Biology

Physics—Prerequisites of Algebra II and current enrollment in or completion of Trigonometry/College Algebra

## SOCIAL STUDIES

High school social studies classes are designed for students to study the cultural, social, economic, and political development of our state, our nation, and our world. As freshmen and sophomores, students will take semester courses in Oklahoma History, Government, Geography, and World History. As juniors, students may choose to complete the required social studies pathway by enrolling in U.S. History or may complete the accelerated pathway by enrolling in Advanced Placement U.S. History as juniors and Advanced Placement Economics as seniors. Students enrolled in U.S. History or Advanced Placement U.S. History will be expected to take the Oklahoma End of Instruction Examination.
